
Your child will be learning about the following this half term:

## Literacy

Fiction – pupils will write a traditional tale with a twist.


Pupils will learn to:

- to use correctly: full stops, capital letters, exclamation/question marks, commas for lists, apostrophe for contracted forms/possessive (singular).
- use expanded noun phrases to describe and specify.
- to use subordination using when, if, that, because and co-ordination using or, and, but.
- to use sentences with different forms: statement, question, exclamation, command.



## Numeracy

Fractions



Pupils will learn to:

- recognise/find/name/write fractions  $\frac{1}{3}$ ,  $\frac{1}{4}$ ,  $\frac{2}{4}$ ,  $\frac{3}{4}$  of a length, shape, set of objects or quantity.
- write simple fractions e.g.  $\frac{1}{2}$  of 6 = 3 and recognise the equivalence of  $\frac{2}{4}$  and  $\frac{1}{2}$ .

Time

Pupils will learn to:

- compare and sequence intervals of time. Know the number of minutes in an hour and the number of hours in a day.
- tell and write the time to five minutes, including quarter past/to the hour and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times.



## Science

Living Things and their Habitats

Pupils will learn to:

- explore and compare the differences between things that are living, dead, and things that have never been alive.
- identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited eg on the seashore, in woodland, in the ocean, in the rainforest.
- describe how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants.
- identify and name a variety of plants and animals in their habitats, including micro- habitats.
- Describe how animals obtain their food from plants and other animals, using the idea of a simple food chain, and identify and name different sources of food.



## Geography

Our Wonderful World

Pupils will learn to:

- name, locate and identify characteristics of the seven continents and oceans.
- use world maps, atlases and globes.
- understand geographical similarities and differences when studying both human and physical geography.
- identify the locations of hot and cold areas around the world.
- use basic vocabulary to refer to physical and human features.
- develop knowledge about the world.



## Art & Design

Sculpture and 3D: Clay houses



Pupils will learn to:

- to use a range of materials creatively to design and make products.
- to develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space.

## Music

Patterns

Pupils will learn to:

- use simple notations.
- play, create and combine rhythms using body percussion.



## ICT/Computing

Pictograms



Pupils will learn to:

- use technology purposefully to create, organise, store, manipulate and retrieve digital content.
- use technology safely and respectfully, keeping personal information private; identify where to go for help and support when they have concerns about content or contact on the internet or other online technologies.

## R.E

How should we care for others and the world, and why does it matter?



Pupils will:

- talk about the benefits and responsibilities of friendship and the ways in which people care for others.
- explore stories from the Bible about friendship and care for others and how these show ideas of good and bad, right and wrong, e.g. Jesus' special friends (Luke 5:1–11), four friends take the paralysed man to Jesus (Luke 5:17–26), 'The good Samaritan' (Luke 10:25–37).

## PE

Multi-skills



Pupils will learn to:

- master basic movements including running, jumping, throwing and catching, as well as developing balance, agility and co-ordination, and begin to apply these in a range of activities.
